

# A VISION OF SNOWDONIA

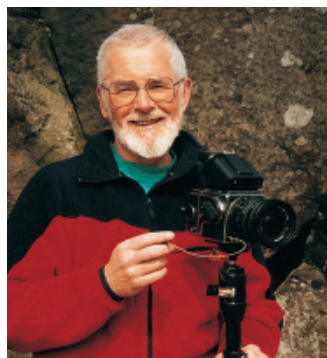

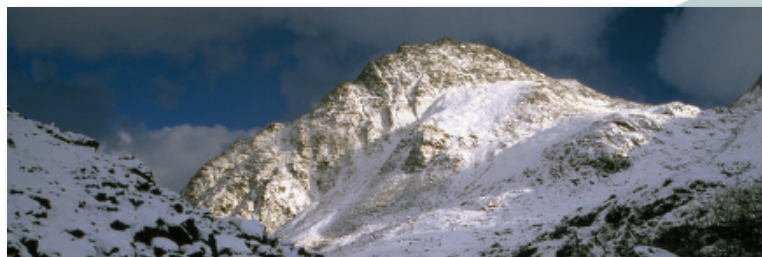
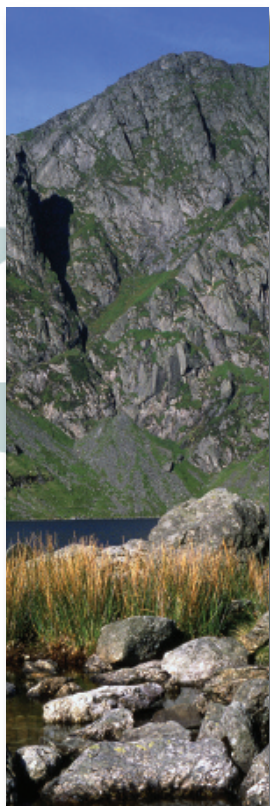
