

This is an original, multi-disciplinary and contemporary review of the Somerset Wetlands through time, with accurate and informative material presented with the intention of appealing to a wide readership. It is lavishly illustrated by many colour photographs.

Geographically the book covers the area generally known as the Somerset Wetlands, extending from Gordano to Ilchester and comprising its Levels and Moors out to the coast along and beyond the Bridgwater Bay National Nature Reserve. Its subject matter is research-based, very varied and presented in three sections: I. The Wetlands Through time. 2. The Wetlands: People, Life and Wildlife. 3. The Wetlands: What Future?

Although there is a core of wildlife and nature conservation, the book aims for a much bolder approach, that of the geo-logical, archaeological and historical heritage set within the Wetland landscape context. A glimpse into possible futures brings it right up to date with the problems of global warming and managed retreat. Apart from the main articles, feature 'boxes' spotlight supporting information and some personal accounts of residents' lives and experiences. An important component is a CD of wetland bird sounds, which imparts a unique aural immediacy to the publication.

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
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
