Most of what is included here comes directly from the author's own collection, or from historic sources provided by toy makers, many of whom no longer exist. Once familiar names abound alongside those we know today: Bing, Hornby, Minic, Marklin, Tri-ang, Scalextric, Lesney, Meccano and Corgi. Hundreds of toys are illustrated along with pages from beautifully produced catalogues of yesteryear including Harrods and Hamleys.

In a fascinating text the author recounts tales from his own childhood and remarkable stories associated with his collecting, buying and selling; the wonderful finds and the bargains, along with the ones that got away.

This book will appeal to everyone who enjoys recalling their childhood days and will hold great interest for collectors too.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Bryan Apps has been an Anglican priest in the Diocese of Winchester for nearly 50 years. His passion for collecting toys and games has remained with him since a boy, although serious collecting only began later in life. This he combined with a number of world record attempts using toys including the record for longest continuous running of a model locomotive. This present work follows on from his book When Motoring Racing Was Fun, published by Halsgrove in 2009, in which his passion for motor racing is revealed through his paintings of racing cars and drivers from the earliest days of the sport, which in turn has led to lasting friendships with many of the most famous racing drivers from before and after the Second World War. A new book Silverstone Shadows is also to be published in 2010.
