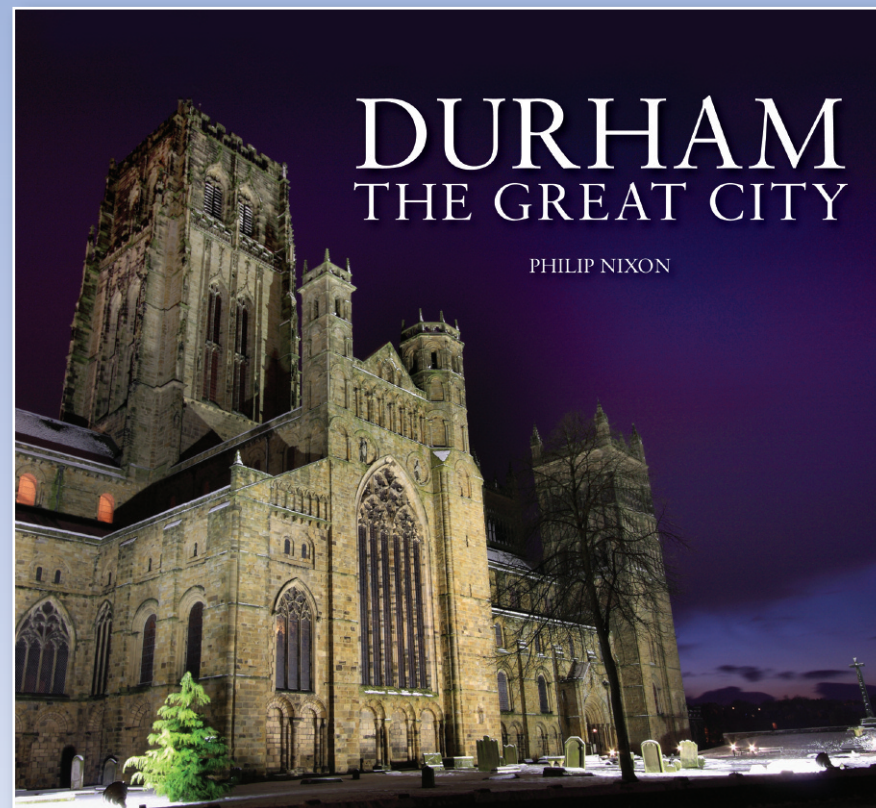

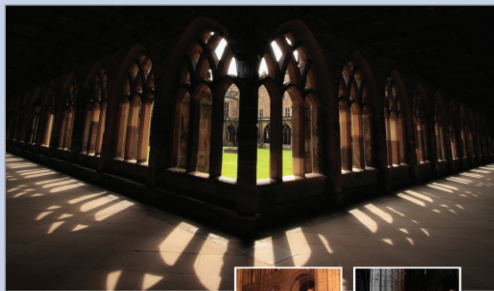

Don Cow Lane takes its name from the panel on the north-west tower of the Chapel of the Nine Altars, but was originally called Eggeson or Eggesgate because this would have been the road along which the bodies were brought for burial.

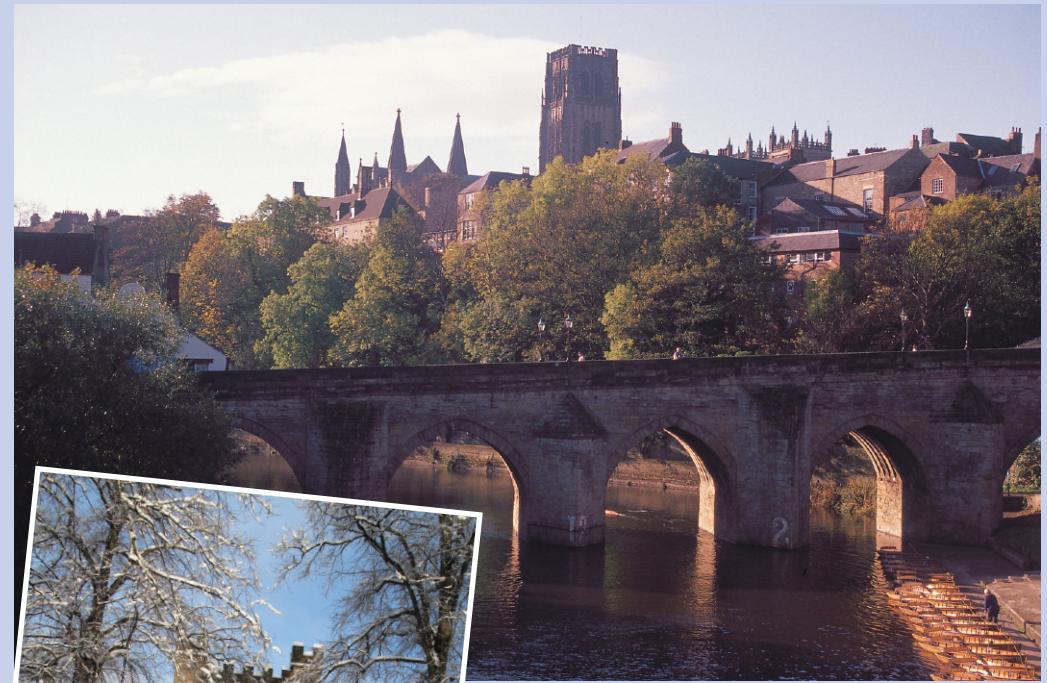
The Chapter was the centre of daily life for a monk. The chapter at Durham was built on the ruins of the Bishop's Palace and the work dragged on slowly up to the time of Bishop Skelton and was not finally finished until 1406. Originally the windows would have been glazed – one series is said to have told the story of St Cuthbert in its stained glass.
